## International Day for the Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons

Established in 2013 by UN General Assembly Resolution 68/32, the day provides an occasion for the world community to reaffirm its commitment to global nuclear disarmament as a high priority. It provides an opportunity to educate the public – and their leaders – about the real benefits of eliminating such weapons, and the social and economic costs of perpetuating them. Indeed, the \$100 billion spent annually on nuclear weapons is sorely needed to help finance the Sustainable Development Goals. The 2013 and 2014 commemoration events at the Palais des Nations in Geneva were organised by UNFOLD ZERO.

### **Chain Reaction 2016**

Chain Reaction 2016 was initiated by UNFOLD ZERO to highlight the breadth and depth of civil society actions around the world supporting the achievement of a nuclear-weapon-free world. It is running from July 8, 2016 (the 20th anniversary of the International Court of Justice case on the illegality of nuclear weapons) until October 2, the International Day of Nonviolence. Any civil society event or action can be posted on the Chain Reaction website and social media, as long as it is respectful and non-violent.
