2012/13 Report of the President

The BPO was inaugurated on November 16th, 2012 in a ceremony held in the major Aula of the University of Basel. Even before that date the BPO director, Mr. Alyn Ware (AW) has personally made efforts to collect funds for its operations by organising the <u>Basel Peace Run</u>. The following list outlines the more important activities being organized by the BPO and its director.

3. Events in which Basel Peace Office played a key role

The director of the BPO, also in his capacity as Global Coordinator of PNND, has furthermore attended numerous Peace and Disarmament conferences, mostly as key note speaker (Mannheim, Aug 12-18; 2012, Delhi; Aug 19-21. Dubrovnik; Sept 14-17; Helsinki, Dec 14 see Basel Peace Office launches archive to support a Middle East Zone free of Nuclear Weapons and other WMD; Fribourg, March 14-17 2013; Copenhagen, April 3/4; Munich, April 26; Ottawa, May 28-30; Geneva, June 5; Seoul, June 17-20; Bonn, Sept 1/2; Geneva, Sept 3; Prague, Sept 4 – 8.

The funding situation of the BPO, which initially had to be considered difficult, has mean-while been alleviated somewhat, due to an agreement between swisspeace and the BPO. Shortly a 2nd agreement is being planned between swisspeace and the Canton of Basel. Both agreements are being facilitated by the Director of swisspeace and BPO board member, Prof. Dr. Laurent Goetschel, which is greatly appreciated.- We furthermore regret the leaving of Christoph Pilger, who has served as assistant to the BPO director until the end of September 2013, and we are grateful for the contributions he has made in the context of establishing the appropriate legal conditions for the BPO. We furthermore thank Prof. Ueli Mäder for hosting the office of the BPO in his premises.
