

September 26, 1983. Stanislav Petrov was in charge of a Soviet nuclear early warning centre when satellites indicated five incoming American nuclear missiles. Protocol required Petrov to report the incoming attack within six minutes to enable a nuclear 'retaliation' before the US weapons hit. Stanislav held off. His decision saved the world from a devastating nuclear holocaust.
